# Roxbury Drive Protected Bike Lane Pilot Project

Take the Community Survey on Options for a Potentially Permanent Design

On September 14, 2021, City Council approved the one-year Roxbury Drive Protected Bike Lane Pilot Project, which includes a southbound parking-protected bike lane and northbound conventional bike lane, connecting to bikeways in both Los Angeles and Beverly Hills and improving bicycle access to Roxbury Park. Bike lanes on Roxbury Drive are identified as high priority in the City's adopted Complete Streets Plan.

The goal of the pilot project was to provide a more comfortable street for people to bicycle on by providing physical separation from moving traffic, while not removing any on-street parking or vehicle travel lanes.


The City is currently evaluating the results of the pilot project and exploring options for potentially transitioning the bike lanes into a permanent street feature. As part of that process, the public is encouraged to take a survey regarding their experiences traveling within or adjacent to the Roxbury Drive Protected Bike Lane Pilot Project and provide their thoughts on a potentially permanent design.

# We Watch Out for Each other Safety Campaign

"Be a Roll Model" around our schools

The September campaign theme is traffic safety around schools. The message to drivers dropping off and picking up children is: "Be a 'roll' model around our schools. Safe transportation starts with you!" Drivers should obey traffic signs and signals, comply with reduced speed limits in school zones, and stop for any families and kids crossing the street. When loading children, drivers should park legally at the curb instead of double-parking. To avoid

congestion at drop-off and pick-up times, parents could try leaving home a couple minutes earlier or biking, walking, or rolling to school.

The October campaign theme is patience. The message to all road users is: "On wheels or feet, be kind on the street!" October is City Civility Month. You never know when someone is having a bad day so be patient with your neighbors. Drivers should think before honking and drive like their kids are watching. All road users should slow down for each other.



### Water Efficiency is a Way of Life

Outdoor water used for the landscape and pools is about two-thirds of the total water used at a typical home in our area. - Water 2 days a week:
  - o North of Santa Monica Blvd = Monday and Friday
  - o South of Santa Monica Blvd = Tuesday and Saturday
- About 8 minutes for pop-up sprinklers and 15-20 for drip irrigation.
- No water run-off on the sidewalk or street
- No watering (sprinklers or hose) after 9 am or before 6 pm
